



SERMON NOTES by Pastor Alf Halvorson



This is the second (and final) in our short New Year's series on <u>Matthew 14:22-33</u>. Last week, we gleaned from the text these insights: It is often when we are obedient that we find ourselves in the *storm*; that Jesus doesn't always seem to come when we call, but that He is never late; and finally, that even in failure, Peter learns to trust Jesus more—and the result is that all those in the boat worship Him. This Sunday, we look at two other facets of this jewel of a passage. One focuses on the idea that from a distance, Christ can only be a scary "ghost." And two, if and when we move toward Christ or allow Him to move toward us, He appears bigger and more able to handle our life and world. We get clarity and our faith expands exponentially.

- From last week's sermon and this week's study, what happened here so that the disciples moved from thinking Jesus was a "ghost" in verse 26 to worshipping Him as the "Son of God" in verse 33? When and how have you, like Peter, moved toward Jesus? And when and how have you allowed Jesus to move toward and get close to you? Are there certain tools or practices or disciplines that help toward this end?
- 2. Why are perceptions of Jesus and following Him always skewed and out of focus from a distance? Or, to put it in another way, why must the specific Jesus meet you in your particular and real life—rather than a remote Lord call to you from some general and far-away place and attempt to connect to your theoretical or general existence?
- 3. In Verses 32 and 33, puny faith becomes full-throated worship and growing trust. Place yourself in Peter's shoes. Then place yourself in the place of the disciples in the boat. Why is community so important in coming to Christ and also growing in Christ (justification and sanctification)? How can we play off of each other as together we seek to know and follow our Savior and Lord?
- 4. Finally, how has this text (and discussion of it) helped you know how to approach 2021, perhaps differently from 2020? How and where is God leading you that will require you to risk, to get out of the boat, to answer "Okay, I'll go" to Jesus' command of "Come with Me"? Pray for each other as you share your answers.
