








SERMON NOTES by Rev. Beth Case



Since last Sunday's text (Acts 21:1-17), Paul has completed his 400+-mile trip to Jerusalem and been welcomed by believers there. However, in less than a week, riots ensue. Paul is arrested and tried before Festus and Agrippa; he eventually appeals to Ceasar. Because of his Roman citizenship, Paul's captors have no choice but to send him to Rome, accompanied by a centurion and protected by a regiment of soldiers. As they board a relatively small grain ship bound for Italy, the soldiers and sailors are included in the "we" of this, the fifth in our Sermon Series on the "We Passages" of Acts.

- 1. Similar to the footage of *Titanic*, *The Perfect Storm*, or *Jaws*, Acts 27 depicts a terrifying, seasick-making, life-threatening sea storm. When have you felt caught by a *noreaster*, carried along by a wind of indomitable force? What is the greatest pressure you are facing right now?
- 2. What do we learn about the severity of the storm from looking closely into Acts 27:13-20, 27?
- 3. In addition to the storm detailed in Acts 27, Paul says he survived two other storms. Read 2 Corinthians 11:23-28; what other difficulties did Paul face? How do you think these experiences shaped his perspective on God? On these challenging situations?
- 4. I shared of MDPC's Young Adult Lead Team discussing the question: "When have you felt closest to God?" How would you answer that same question? Discuss.
- 5. In Acts 27:30-32 we read that the sailors attempted an escape utilizing the ship's lifeboat. When Paul discovers this, he employs the soldiers with instructions that if any are to be saved, all must remain aboard. What might this say to us about community, about the "we"?
- 6. I invited us to consider the purpose of storms throughout Scripture. Which of the following ideas of life's "storms" do you default to (more than one may apply)? How does Acts 27 challenge or affirm your perspective?
 - a) Advice for Escape: the Bible tells us how to avoid/escape life's storms
 - b) Moral Musts: God is punishing me or teaching me a lesson; when I learn it, the storm will stop
 - c) Storms Happen: the presence of trouble may not point to my failure or God's absence
 - d) God is Sovereign & Present in the Storm: God doesn't always stop the storm; sometimes God gives us purpose in the storm and/or saves us through the storm
- 7. An old song by Scott Krippayne says, "...sometimes God holds us close and lets the wind and waves go wild; sometimes He calms the storm; other times He calms His child." To what extent is this true in Acts 27?
- 8. Read Acts 27:44. All lives aboard this corn ship are spared! Those who wash up on this island, as well as Luke's earliest readers, would have known that to survive a storm at sea was to be portrayed as righteous. What might this say about Paul's upcoming trial? What can we learn from this passage about God's sovereignty, God's salvation, and God's purposes – even in times of insurmountable pressure?
- 9. Elements were added to the Golden Gate Bridge so that a source of death would become a source of safety, productivity, and connection. How might this story of engineering and construction provide a metaphor for our relationship with God and others?
