SERMON NOTES



The Mustard Seed & Yeast Luke 13:18-21 | Pastor Alf Halvorson

This is the sixth in our Fall Series on the Parables from Luke. Jesus begins the two parables that we will look at today with the phrase, "What is the Kingdom of God like?" Or, "To what should I compare the kingdom of God?" Don't you want to know? We pray each week in our services, "Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven." As Jesus tells these parables, He is trying to give His disciples handles and images about what is breaking into their midst because of the incarnation and what will ultimately be the dominant kingdom forever and ever (Lk. 1:33). It is not so much about geography here, but rather 'where is God in the midst of our lives and our world?' How does God's rule and love and justice and will and goodness make its way into life? How does this Kingdom emerge and what's our role as disciples in it?

- 1. Where are you overwhelmed right now? Where are the problems in your life or of this world so large that they seem impossible to overcome? In what matter is your faith small and fragile?
- 2. Read Luke 13:18-21. Focus on verses 18 & 19 first. What do you think the big comparison is here for Jesus? Why or how is a mustard seed like the Kingdom of God? How might that comfort us? Who do you think the birds of the air are? And what is the significance of nests being built in the branches of the mature mustard tree?
- 3. Obviously a mustard seed is one of the smallest seeds. It starts small but Jesus says it ends up as a big tree. Where have you seen the same thing regarding some Kingdom Issue? What started incredibly small but has grown in power and influence for good and for God?
- 4. Focus on verses 20 & 21. This second parable compares the Kingdom to leaven (yeast) a woman mixes in with three measures of flour. The Greek Word is enekrypson. We get the word encrypt from this word. It is hidden in the flour but then is the fermenting agent that transforms the flour and water into bread. What is Jesus saying about himself and what He can do in a life and in our world?
- 5. What is a 'tree' good for here? And what is 'bread' good for here? How are individual Christians and the church supposed to be trees and bread? What might that look like for you this week?
- 6. If you and I are soil or flour, how can we allow the mustard seed of the kingdom or the yeast of the kingdom to be added to our lives? How can we nurture our soil or knead the dough? How can we submit or surrender to God's planting, plowing, watering, and kneading activities?
