# BELIEVE

## The Forgiveness of Sins The Resurrection of the Body *Matthew 16:13-23 by Alf Halvorson*

These are the last Sermon Notes in our Apostles' Creed Series. I preached on **the forgiveness of sins** on Good Friday and then on **the Resurrection of the Body** and the **Life Everlasting** on Easter Sunday. Both are such critical topics to our life and faith and life together.

1. What are your normal Holy Week and Easter Traditions? How have they changed this year? What losses do you feel? What new opportunities have emerged?
2. Read I John 1:5-2:2. I talked about three aspects of forgiveness in my Good Friday Sermon. What hit you about the aspect, "if we say we have no sin we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us?" In what ways did Karl Menninger and the five definitions of sin from the New Testament help you think through how you and the whole world are sinners?
3. How did the second section of "but if we confess our sin, God who is faithful and just, will forgive us our sin and cleanse us from all unrighteousness" combine with my sharing about Donald Miller when he was 13 and John Calvin's idea of bowing twice? When and how do you confess your sin? Have you bowed twice?
4. And how did the third aspect of "and not for our (sins) only, but also for the sins of the whole world" combine with the Creed's placing 'the forgiveness of sins' in its last section on the Hoy Ghost and the Church/world? C. S. Lewis has written, "to be a Christian means to forgive the inexcusable because God has forgiven the inexcusable in you." Where is that needed in your dealings with others right now?
5. Now read the amazing post-resurrection appearance of Jesus with Simon at the Sea of Galilee in John 21:1-19. I said that my 'picture of Easter' this year is of Simon Version 1.0 and Simon Version 2.0. How does Jesus show himself to Simon and the rest of the disciples that morning at the lake? What does he do first? Then how does he address Simon's three denials? How does that change Simon into the leader of the early church? How is Peter resurrected to new life on earth and then confident about resurrection into eternity with God?
6. What does the last phrase of the Apostles' Creed, "I believe in the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting," mean to you? It's not talking about Jesus' Resurrection here. That was covered in the first movement of the Creed. Our resurrection is covered here. For those who believe in Jesus as Savior and Lord, there is the assurance of new life in this world because of the empty tomb and life eternal in the heavenly realm after we die. How might that give us peace and purpose and hope in a Coronavirus World? How might you 'tend and feed His sheep/lambs' and 'follow Him' this Easter?
