#### The Request of James and John

# SERMON NOTES

Sunday, January 5, 2020





Called to Service Mark 10:35-45 | Dave Steane preaching

On this first Sunday of 2020, we are privileged to ordain and install a new class of elders and deacons to provide leadership and support to MDPC's ministries. This is a very special day for us! God has called an amazing group of people to serve Jesus in and through this great community of faith.

The core of being a Christian leader is to embrace the model of servant leadership exhibited by Jesus Christ. In their best-selling book, Lead Like Jesus, authors Ken Blanchard and Phil Hodges offer this important perspective, "For followers of Jesus, servant leadership isn't an option: it's a mandate. Servant leadership is to be a living statement of who we are in Christ, how we treat one another, and how we demonstrate the love of Christ to the whole world. If this sounds like serious business with profound implications – it is!"

In Mark 10:35-45 we find a curious exchange between Jesus and two of His disciples. In Matthew's version of the same conversation (Matthew 20:20-28), it's the mother of these two disciples who asks Jesus for places of power and prominence for her sons.

- James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached Jesus and made a bold request: grant that we may sit on your right and left hands in glory. In ancient times, the right and left side of a King were places of special honor and standing. Reflect on ways that you have seen someone make a similar request. How have you perceived the motives for such a request?
- Jesus responded to James and John by asking them if they were able to drink His cup and be baptized with His baptism. Jesus was referring to His mission and eventual martyrdom. The brothers indicated that they could, and, knowing the fate of His disciples, Jesus agreed that they would share his cup and baptism. In what ways have you shared in Jesus' cup and baptism?
- Jesus added that the decision who would sit at His right and left hand was not up to Him, but those places would go to those for whom it was prepared. What does this reveal about Jesus?
- The other ten disciples became indignant at the request of James and John. What do you see as the nature of the negative comments toward the brothers? In what ways can you identify with this?
- Jesus offered a cultural commentary on the leaders of the day. He said the rulers of the Gentiles lord their authority over others. What parallels do you see today?
- Jesus offered a radically different view of greatness and leadership. In contrast, Jesus said whoever wished to be great must become a servant; whoever wished to be first must become a slave (servant). Reflect on examples you've seen of this type of leadership.
- Finally, Jesus pointed to Himself as the perfect example of servant leadership. He said, "the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." In what ways can you adopt this attitude and behavior? Where do you need to re-think your understanding of servant leadership?
