Curriculum Information

As you may (or may not) know our threeyear-old classes use Frog Street Press as our primary curriculum. This curriculum goes hand in hand with the classic preschool themes we have used for years but adds additional components for fine motor skill development, math, science and literacy.

Our Pre-K classes will continue to utilize the Learning Without Tears curriculum which is an extension of the Handwriting Without Tears curriculum.

Kindergarten will be utilizing the Lucy Calkins Units of Study in Phonics curriculum (currently used in Kindergarten at Spring Branch ISD schools) in addition to Handwriting Without Tears.

Specialty Classes

This year, our specialty classes will be Music and Movement (taught by Enrichment Services), Spanish (taught by Rocio Chacon), and Chapel (taught by Mayra Escamilla and Rachel Poysky).

With the current COVID situation, all specialty classes will begin in January. This will ensure that our children stay as healthy as possible!
